The Islamic Conference of Culture Ministers will hold its 7th session in Algiers on 18-19 December 2011, on the theme of 'Towards Consolidating the Outcome of the International Year for the Rapprochement of Cultures and Enhancing the Youth's Role in Building a Culture of Peace and Dialogue'.

The Islamic Conference of Culture Ministers, which will be held under the patronage of H.E. Abdelaziz Bouteflika, President of the People's Democratic Republic of Algeria, will bring together the Culture Ministers of the OIC Member States.

A roundtable on "the Cultural Roles of the Civil Society in the Promotion of Dialogue and Peace" will be held as part of the Conference, jointly organized by ISESCO and the OIC General Secretariat, in collaboration with the Algerian Ministry of Culture.

The Conference will look into three reports that will be submitted by ISESCO Director General, Dr Abdulaziz Othman Altwaijri, on the implementation of the Cultural Strategy for the Islamic World, ISESCO's efforts in the implementation of the Strategy for Islamic Cultural Action outside the Islamic World, and on ISESCO's efforts in the follow-up of the implementation of the Strategy for ICTs Development in the Islamic World.

It will furthermore examine four draft documents prepared by ISESCO on the initiative of the Custodian of the Two Holy Mosques for Dialogue among Followers of Religions and Cultures: Achievements and Future Prospects; the Cultural Roles of the Civil Society in the Promotion of Dialogue and Peace; Cultural Enterprises in the Member States, and on a Course in Training Journalists to Counter Stereotypes about Islam and Muslims in Western Media.

Also, the delegations participating in the Conference will submit national reports on the Member States' efforts in implementing the Cultural Strategy for the Islamic World.

The first session of the Islamic Conference of Culture Ministers was held in Dakar (1989), the second in Rabat (1998), the third in Doha (2001), the fourth in Algiers (2004), the fifth in Tripoli (2007) and the sixth in Baku (2009).



ALGIERS, 23 Muharram/19 Dec (IINA)- As part of the 7th Islamic Conference of Culture Ministers, which commenced its proceedings this morning in Algiers, a ministerial roundtable on “The Cultural Roles of the Civil Society in the Promotion of Dialogue and Peace” was held following the opening session.

The roundtable was chaired by Dr Abdulaziz Othman Altwaijri, Director General of the Islamic Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ISESCO), who made an address, in which he highlighted the different cultural roles played by the civil society in fostering the culture of dialogue and promoting the values of peace in the Islamic communities.

Likewise, he underlined that ISESCO’s awareness of the importance of civil society’s role, together with the mutations witnessed by the Islamic world towards democracy, greater human rights and more effective participation by women and the youth in the development of a new model of citizenship, made ISESCO, the Islamic world’s competent body in education, science and culture, devise a study on the cultural roles the civil society can play to promote peace

and dialogue, and devote the present ministerial roundtable to thoroughly discuss the subject and adopt the suitable position thereof.

He also pointed out that chief among these cultural roles are the fostering of the peace and justice values, as Islamic and human values, the consolidation of the role of civil society, so as to enable it to carry out its mission in supporting governmental institutions, in accordance with the action priorities in the Islamic world, and coordinating with NGOs in the Member States to develop a code of conduct for them; which will define their fields of action at the local, national, regional and international levels, and allow them to operate in international forums as a harmonious group that share the same objectives and priorities.

“It is in this particular context that the ministerial roundtable is held, as a lead-in to the Conference”, Dr Altwaijri furthermore underscored. He also emphasized that ISESCO will seek to adopt this approach, championed by the Consultative Council for the Implementation of the Cultural Strategy for the Islamic World, in the Conference’s future sessions, through the choice of a topic worthy of being discussed by a ministerial roundtable.

The roundtable also included speeches by Mrs. Khalida Toumi, Culture Minister of Algeria, President of the Seventh Islamic Conference of Culture Ministers; and Mr. Aboulfas Garayev, Minister of Culture and Tourism of Azerbaijan, President of the Conference’s previous session.

Also addressing the roundtable’s opening session were Mrs. Mounia Meslem, Secretary General of Rachda Association (Algeria), and Mr. Boubakar Zemmal, President of ‘El-Beyt for Culture and Arts’ association (Algeria).

A communiqué was issued by the roundtable which constitutes an all-inclusive vision of the part to be taken by civil society institutions and organizations to promote culture and peace, in a spirit of mutual respect and recognition of cultural diversity.

According to IRNA the participants at the 7th Conference of the Islamic Countries Culture Ministers at Algerian capital city here on Monday agreed with the hosting of their 10th conference in 2017 by the Islamic Republic of Iran.

51 countries, including the Islamic Republic of Iran are the comprising members of ICESCO.

The 7th ministerial conference of PIC was held in the presence of over 40 delegations from as many Islamic countries in Algeria's capital city, Algiers, and ended its work on Monday night.
